Tracy Lee	4-6 inch single and semi-double white flowers with pink tinge, brownstamens with purple tips.	Late May and June	6-8 feet	Moderate
Violet Stargazer	4 inch deep purple with white bar and dark center. Also known as 'Venosa Violacea' long bloomer, good cut flower and tolerates some shade.	June to September	8-10 feet	Hard

Akebia Quinata (Chocolate Vine)	Lush green foliage and purple blooms that cover the vine and have a sweet smell of chocolate	Early Spring	15-20 feet	Hard
Dutchman's Pipe (Aristolochia durior)	Small yellowish-green flowers resemble a meerschaum pipe	Early Summer	30 feet	None
Hercules Bittersweet	Orange berries with yellow center. Need female to produce berries.	Fall	36 feet	None
Dropmore Scarlet Honeysuckle	Small, oblong scarlet flowers. Fragrant. Attracts hummingbirds.	Summer	8-12 feet	Moderate
Goldflame Honeysuckle	Reddish-pink flowers with soft yellow throats	Summer	10-20 feet	Moderate
Harlequin Honeysuckle	Fragrant small cream trumpet-shaped flower on variegated green foliage with pinkish edge	Continuous	10-12 feet	Moderate
Honey Baby Honeysuckle	Large creamy-yellow fragrant flowers	July thru October	6-7 feet	Moderate
Late Dutch Honeysuckle	Purple-red with soft pink throat very fragrant	Summer	15-18 feet	Moderate
Scentsaton Honeysuckle	Very showy vine with extremely fragrant yellow flowers blooms. Bright red berries after flowering	Mid-Spring to late Summer	10-15 feet	As needed

Flava Trumpet Vine	1½ –2½ inch long yellow trumpet-shaped flowers	Midsummer	30 feet	As needed
Indian Summer Trumpet Vine	3-inch long orange-red flowers on first years growth	Midsummer	12-15 feet	None
Orange Trumpet Vine	2-inch orange trumpet flowers	Midsummer	30 feet	As needed
Silver Lace Vine	¼ - ½ inch creamy white flowers	August and September	15-20 feet	Hard

Moderate: Prune and tie stems in early spring when weather permits. Remove all dead and weak stems, and trim the remaining stems 5-8 inches to where a strong pair of leaf buds appear. All remaining stems should be tied in a position that gives sufficient space for new growth

Hard: Prune in late April or early May depending on weather conditions. Pruning consists of removing all top growth down to where the strong new leaf axil buds appear, just above the base of the previous season's stems
